MEETING OF THE FIP THEMATIC COMMISSION  
Tokyo, 22nd November 1991

1. OPENING AND ROLL CALL

PRESENT Dr. Ing. Giancarlo Morolli, FIP Thematic Commission President, Snr. E. Buttini, FIP Board Co-ordinator for Thematic Philately, Mr. Gunnar Dahlvig, Vice President of Commission and attending delegate. Roll call and registration of proxies was held.

The President opened the meeting by welcoming Snr. Buttini the FIP Board member who represents Thematic Philately to the Board.

A minutes silence was held for Messrs Mario Bueno Heimerle and Leon Rapkin.

2. MINUTES OF THE MEETING IN LONDON.

The minutes of the meeting in London on 11th May, 1990 were unanimously approved.

3. REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

3.1. Mr. Mario Bueno Heimerle passed away October 1991. Mr. S.P. Chatterjea, Bureau member has resigned from the Commission due to health reasons. Mario Anghelopoulos and Joseph Peeters left the Commission

He welcomed to the Commission the new delegates, Jose Antonio Hernan Sejas, Rameshwardas Binani, Manos Anagnostou, Yannick Delaey, and Dan Angelescu. After the re-unification of Germany, Hans-Walter Bosserhoff will be the delegate.

3.2. The 3rd version of updated SREV and Guidelines was passed around. A major change was the incorporation of 'SIZE' (5 points) into Development (now 30 points). Size was something difficult to judge and the thematic class had been the only class to include it.

Another change has been the use of modified terminology to make it clearer for collectors/exhibitors to know and understand what the jury looked for when judging, and to help them to be more creative in their exhibits.

Dr. Morolli and Mr. Dahlvig have worked together on the SREV and GUIDELINES and version 4 will be released for consideration prior to Granada 92.

3.3. Regarding the meeting in Granada, the President remarked that the Thematic Commission needed a good bureau who was going to work together. He needed the National Federations to appoint workers as their representatives, not just a "mailbox address". Names of persons nominated for the bureau had to be sent by post to the President Dr. G. Morolli by 15th December 1991. Bureau elections will be held in Granada. There will be no meeting of the Commission at Genova 92.

3.4. Project Thema did not take off as expected.

3.5. Regarding F.I.P. proposed rotation of judges - a good common and consistent standard of judging is needed from exhibition to exhibition. An evaluation form for judges, compels the judge to check his results and is one of the best tools for Jury members.
